

Building Good Habits & Routines

Set up a conducive learning space and schedule a regular homework time. Limit play time and use of devices.


Encourage reading of age appropriate books. Encourage the reading of instructions before attempting assigned work. Cultivate the habit of checking for accuracies upon completion of work. Be prepared for lessons. Pack all needed resources the night before and not in the morning. Review, reflect and consolidate one week's learning over each weekend.

Absence from School

Parents Gateway Mobile Application



Parents Gateway mobile application will be the main platform for disseminating school-wide notices, advisories and newsletters etc. and for administrative tasks such as update of parents'/guardians' contact details, travel declaration, etc..



- Any changes in students' personal details including parents/guardians' contact details MUST be promptly updated.
- Current and accurate student information is crucial to facilitate expeditious action in any contingency.



- All visitors to school are required to sign in at the security post.
- All visitor passes issued must be prominently displayed by wearers at all times to enable school staff to identify authorised visitors within the school premises.
- Opening and closing times for the school exits/entrances as detailed in the Student's Handbook are strictly observed.



- Avoid driving into school during morning school arrival period (06.45 to 07.30 AM) due to the very heavy traffic along the surrounding roads and within the school compound
 - Park at neighbourhood carparks and walk your child to school.
- Observe all traffic rules and be considerate of other road users.
 - Do not stop vehicles directly in front of school gates to drop off passengers.
 - Teach your child to disembark briskly and safely.




Inculcating Responsibility in Students



Students are expected to take personal responsibility for themselves and their belongings. School will not convey to students their forgotten personal items delivered to the General Office, except spectacles and medication. Students are not allowed to use mobile devices (eg mobile phones, ipads, smart watches, tablets, etc) in school unless with permission from teachers.

Parents are strongly discouraged from giving such devices to lower primary students.
